



Making humanitarian response more flexible

Exploring new models and approaches

Background

ALNAP is organising a closed workshop to explore what flexible humanitarian action looks like and how to support it, drawing on original research and recent work by ALNAP Members and colleagues in the development sector.

Aims of the workshop

- To share learning on what has enabled flexible and adaptive humanitarian action across different contexts.
- To discuss new models for humanitarian action that enable greater flexibility and how these can be taken forward, encompassing four key organisational functions: programming (including monitoring), logistics and supply chain management, human resources management and funding/fundraising.

Taking place over two days, this workshop will be discussion-oriented and feature peer-sharing sessions where participants will have the opportunity to:

- · exchange their experiences around changing what, where and how humanitarian action is delivered
- discuss enablers that allow for these changes to happen in an appropriate time frame.

The discussion sessions throughout the workshop will examine lessons from case studies and participants will explore practical approaches to developing flexibility across organisational functions, including funding agreements, programming, and supply chain systems.

Travel and visa requirements:

It is the responsibility of each conference attendee to secure their own flights, accommodation, travel insurance and a British entry visa before departure. Please make sure your passport is valid before travelling.

In order to obtain a visa from the local British embassy, you will need a signed visa invitation letter from ALNAP. To receive your invitation letter in time, please contact events@alnap.org as soon as possible with the following details:

- Passport number, expiry date, full name
- Your official title/position within your own organisation
- The full and official name of your organisation
- The organisation, if different from above, that will cover the costs of your travel to the UK
- The dates of your intended flights, including the dates of entry and exit of the UK

Please do not forget to bring the required documents and adequate hard currency upon landing in the UK

Where is the workshop?

How do I get to the workshop?

You can choose from a range of transport options to reach the venue:

- The venue is adjacent to **Southwark** tube station on the **Jubilee** line.
- Blackfriars station provides access to and from mainline railway services, including Thameslink for Eurostar services from St Pancras International, South East Trains, and the District and Circle lines for City Airport via Bank.
- Waterloo and London Bridge stations are each a 10-15 minutes walk away.

For more travel information, use <u>Transport for London</u> or <u>National Rail Enquiries</u>.

Transport to and from London airports:

- London Heathrow, Gatwick and Stansted airports have dedicated express train services into central London.
- London Heathrow and London City airports are directly connected to the Tube network.
- National Express, Easybus and Greenline coach transfers run 24 hours a day.
- Taxis are available at every airport, but we recommend booking in advance to avoid high costs.
- Car hire is also available at every airport should you prefer to drive.

The basic monetary unit in the U.K. is the GBP British Pound. You can exchange currencies at the airport and at banks.
